- Bologna Seminar on the internationalisation of the 3<sup>rd</sup> cycle.

As part of the 2007–2009 Work Programme of the Bologna Process, Finland is to host a two-day seminar on the internationalisation of the 3<sup>rd</sup> cycle degrees. The seminar will be held in English.

The topic of the seminar is internationalisation of the 3<sup>rd</sup> cycle and researcher careers: promoting the mobility of researchers and comparable learning outcomes on a European level.

The ministerial meeting in Berlin resolved to include also the 3<sup>rd</sup> cycle postgraduate degrees as part of the Bologna process. Defining comparable and compatible degree structures and learning outcomes, commitment to joint degrees and the internationalisation of postgraduate education were seen as goals at the European level. Moving ahead with the European Higher Education Area (EHEA) was emphasised in London in 2007. An important goal regarding the EHEA is achieving comparability and recognition of degrees through common qualifications frameworks. This will help overcome national and international barriers to the mobility and embloyability of researchers. Improving the status, career prospects and funding for early stage researchers are essential preconditions for strengthening research capacity of Europe. Closer alignment of the EHEA with European Research Area (ERA) remains another important objective.

The aim of the seminar is to share best practices with regard to the internationalisation of the 3<sup>rd</sup> cycle, transparent learning outcomes and more predictable researcher careers.

The seminar is aimed at policy makers, designers and organisers of postgraduate education as well as various stakeholders in the Bologna Process.

# Working group topics

## Competences

Contents and structures of education: What kind of knowledge, skills and competences does postgraduate education produce and who defines them? Linkages to qualifications frameworks.

#### Internationalisation

Internationalisation as an integral aspect of researcher training; structural and systematic international cooperation in postgraduate education. Best practices.

#### Researcher careers

Diversity of researcher careers in academia and elsewhere in the research and innovation system. Transparent and predictable career options: mechanisms to move into and ascend in research career systems. Best practices.
