
Examining Quality Culture -project

- Co-funded by the EC's Lifelong Learning Programme
- Started in October 2009
- Two phases:
 - ✓ a survey questionnaire to HEIs addressing the part of the ESG dedicated to internal QA within HEIs.
 - ✓ Examining the most promising good practices and reflecting their relationship to and in the development of an institutional quality culture
- Results of the first phase are due in September 2010
 - ✓ In the following data is based on the first 190 answers, not final results!

Information on intended learning outcomes publicly available:






What kind of information does a university provide? Il

- University's own information system typically includes the following data on study programmes:
 - ✓ qualifications granted by the programme
 - ✓ the intended learning outcomes of the programme
 - ✓ the teaching, learning and assessment procedures used within the programme
 - ✓ the learning opportunities (e.g., traineeships, exchange programmes, mobility possibilities, scholarships...) available to the students of the programme


