

Higher Education in Ireland


Student numbers – growth



- Increasingly diverse student population requiring additional supports




National Plan for Equity of Access: 2008-2013. HEA (2008)






Alcohol

Alcohol Consumption Per Adult (> 15yrs age) Ireland 1960 - 2008



EUROSTUDENT Questions: 4.1 "Where do you live during study terms/semester?", 4.3 "Please try to calculate your average monthly expenses by type of


