

The National Qualifications Framework of Estonia

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Periodes of Development (1)

- 1991-2005 development and implementation of educational legislation; no explicit mentioning of qualifications system or qualifications framework
- 1998-2008 bottom-up development process of the professional (vocational) qualifications system (PQS)
- 2001 Parliament adopted the Professions Act; 5-levels professional qualifications framework, institutional structure of the system
- 2001 Estonian Qualifications Authority (*Kutsekoda*) was established as support structure for the PQS





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Periodes of Development (2)

- 2007 Government set the goal to develop sustainable, flexible, internationally compatible competence based qualifications system meeting the needs of lifelong learning
- 2008 Parliament adopted new Professions Act; 8levels Estonian National Qualifications Framework (ENQF) compatible with EQF
- 2009 Kutsekoda appointed as National Coordination Point for EQF implementation
- 2009-2011 referencing ENQF to EQF





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Guiding Principles (1)

- Qualifications system (QS) is an interface between society and lifelong learning system
- Professional QS is a sub-system of QS (an interface between labour market and lifelong learning system)
- QS in Estonia follows integrated qualifications system model
- QS is a quality assurance system







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Guiding Principles (2)

- Social partnership of stakeholders is of crucial importance
- ENQF is a backbone of QS in Estonia
- Development and implementation of QS is a process
- Developing and implementing **NQF** is a driver of the process




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Conceptual Framework (1)




Competence cycle (1)

Professions Act (2008)


- 8-level ENQF compatible with EQF
- Entirely competence (learning outcomes) based approach to (professional) qualifications system
- Regulated education approach possibility to award primary professional (vocational) qualification on graduation from VET institution or HEI (starting from January 1, 2011)
- Quality assurance principles based on
 - SO17024 (personal certification)

 - Higher education standard (2008)
 - Vocational education standard (2009) + national curricula for VET
 - National curriculum for basic school (2010)
 - National curriculum for upper secondary school (2010)



Referencing of ENQF to EQF

- March 2010 establishing steering committee
- November 2010 drafting of referencing report
- February 2011 consultations with international experts
- March 2011 consensus building in Estonia
- June 2011 referencing report is presented to the EQF Advisory Group (AG)
- December 2011 approval by the EQF AG




