## What is referencing?

- "Referencing is a process that results in the establishment of a <u>relationship</u> between the <u>levels</u> of the European meta-framework (EQF) and the <u>national</u> <u>qualifications framework (NQF) or system</u>"
- "The referencing process (hence) needs to embrace both objectivity and consensus as elements of trust"









### What is referencing?

- "Referencing processes can only capture how the national system relates to the EQF <u>at a given point in</u> time."
- "...a significant first approximation towards relating a national system to the EQF.... Further adjustments may be necessary..."

### AWARDS IN THE FRAMEWORK

There are four types of award in the National Framework of Qualifications:

- Major Awards: are the principal class of awards made at a level
- Minor Awards: are for partial completion of the outcomes for a Major Award
- Supplemental Awards: are for learning that is additional to a Major Award
- Special Purpose Awards: are for relatively narrow or purpose-specific achievement











## Ireland's experience

- 2003 National Framework of Qualifications launched
- 2006 Verification of Compatibility with Framework for Qualifications of the European Higher Education Area ('Bologna')
- 2009 Referencing to European Qualifications Framework (June)
